

## Transporting patients safely in elevators

S	STOP the line, speak up
т	TAKE the time to review, ask, check
0	<b>OPTIMIZE</b> communication; use names, numbers, letters, and repeat back
Ρ	PUSH unresolved issues up the chain of command

## What you can do every day:

- Shorten beds before entering elevators
- If possible, remove items from head/foot boards
- Be aware of your surrounding & staff positioning

Enter/Exit the Elevator Straight on – Ensure bed wheels are facing forward





## Safety Tips:

- Refer to your SAFETY BADGE for who to call

  - Call <u>Security</u> if escalation is needed 415-885-7890
- Be aware of where your other staff are positioned before pushing beds all the way into elevators or exiting elevators.
